**Int** And did you ever have any pet lambs or pet pigs or anything?

**RM** Aye, we'd pet pigs.

Int Right.

**RM** We used to have pet pigs in a tea chest in the house up beside the fire and they used to be fed with, just with milk in a bottle, you know, and a tit on it and,

**Int** What size of pigs were they?

**RM** Och, they were wee pigs and then they'd have been maybe six or seven weeks before they'd have went outside.

Int Right.

**RM** Maybe up to ten weeks and I mind when people used to be in on their cailey there'd have been two pigs maybe in a box and they'd have sit up in the box, sit up with their two front feet out over the box listening to the whole conversation.

**Int** I'd love to have seen that.

**RM** And then whenever they were took out then to be fed, then they - skipped round the floor and said wugh, wugh, you know the way they do there,

Int Uh-huh.

**RM** and run under the table and all.

Int Uh-huh (XX)

**RM** But they used to, when people come in at night they just, they never s- done nothing or they, they made no noise or nothing they just sit there with their two front feet out over the edge of the box I- watching from one to the other and listening to every word.
